**SPECIFIC ROLE RESPONSIBILITIES:**

1. To undertake teaching, learning and assessment in Motor Vehicle.
2. Provide current technical, industrial, professional or academic expertise in a skills priority and /or skills shortage area across practices in Motor Vehicle repair.
3. Contribute to the development of new curriculum content and courses in skills priority / skills shortage areas within the Motor Vehicle sector.
4. Share current and specialist expertise across the course delivery team (e.g. through regular communication and / or the delivery of high quality CPD and industrial updating).
5. To maintain, and help develop new, links with industry for the subject sector area.
6. Strong understanding of apprenticeships, apprenticeship standards, Knowledge of EPA (End Point Assessment) requirements
7. Understanding of ESFA funding rules and compliance
8. Ability to build and maintain strong employer partnerships, Conduct workplace reviews and progress meetings
