CORE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Support learners to produce work using specialist techniques
- 2. Demonstrate technical techniques, technology and equipment to students as required by teaching staff to support study programmes
- 3. Prepare and maintain the facilities and equipment to a high standard and ensure that the area and learners are compliant with all relevant Health and Safety Legislation including **COSHH** regulations
- 4. Maintain and organise teaching spaces in relation to curriculum need
- 5. Introduce new techniques and technologies relevant to subject area
- 6. Prepare facilities and equipment for teaching
- 7. Assist in the delivery of the technical elements as directed by teaching members of staff
- 8. Order consumables and equipment for curriculum area
- 9. Oversee the technical aspects of students work and use of specialist resources and equipment across the curriculum
- 10. Oversee technical aspects of visiting speaker programme including booking guest lecturers and workshops
- 11. Liaise with stakeholders and external practitioners
- 12. Keep abreast of new technologies, and demonstrate new equipment to students
- 13. Facilitate small groups of students in technical workshops and support independent learning sessions
- 14. To cover the counter in instances of staff absence, or to cover breaks
- 15. Maintain equipment

Art

- 1. Support students to construct artworks in a range of media, which may include painting, drawing, print, 3D and digital techniques
- 2. Lead on the technical aspects of public exhibitions
- 3. Prepare and display artwork in the Creative Arts galleries
- 4. Support the technical aspects departments public and community art projects and the artist in residence

Media & Music

- 1. Oversee the technical aspects of the recording studios, film studios and other specialist facilities
- 2. Implement the AV aspects of the departments events and activities including music performances
- 3. Produce digital imagery for projection
- 4. Implement emerging technologies for media filmmaking in expanded forms such as VR, 360

Performing Arts

- 1. Oversee the technical aspects of students public performances
- 2. Oversee the technical aspects of the theatre
- 3. Support touring companies and external performances
- 4. Facilitate workshops using external practitioners
- 5. Support students to construct sets, props
- 6. Provide projection sound and lighting support for productions
- 7. Produce digital imagery for projection

Photography

- 1. Oversee the technical aspects of the specialist photography facilities, including the dark rooms and studios
- 2. Support students with the whole photographic process from camera techniques, to postproduction and printing
- 3. Photograph student work for archiving and promotional purposes
- 4. Colour calibrate the printers and Macs

Visual and Digital Arts

- 1. Support the students with the technical aspects of projects across multiple disciplines such as Art, Photography, Graphic Design and Computer Games
- 2. Facilitate the use of resources including art studios, Macs, cameras, VR equipment and Games consoles
- 3. Oversee the resources at Bridge Street, distributing equipment to students
- 4. Provide technical support for students working independently

- 1. Support students individually when producing practical projects
- 2. Oversee the technical aspects of students' artwork across the breadth of the HE curriculum, including Art, Photography, Computer Games, Media and Performing Arts
- 3. Run the technical aspects of the Quarry Hill Gallery, supporting artists/exhibitors

- 4. Update HE Creative Arts and other social media and promote activities to students and a wider audience
- 5. Oversee technical aspects of the departments public activities
- 6. Produce imagery to promote internal and external activities
- 7. Support the technical aspects departments public and community art projects and the artist in residence
