SUMMARY OF DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Responsible for the planning and delivery of one to one and /or group lessons with students on the BA Voice (Performance & Pedagogy) course within the Department of Popular Music and Voice
2. Delivering other specialist teaching in voice and voice related subjects through extra curricular events where relevant
3. Assisting and facilitating student performances and events
4. Acting as a member for the voice assessment panels of live performance work as well as assessing any relevant student work submitted via the VLE
5. Working closely with the Academic Managers in the Department of Popular Music and Voice to develop the voice provision
6. Representing the discipline of voice in the development of departmental strategies and curriculum

DUTIES:

1. *The role-holder will:* Deliver teaching at undergraduate level, as agreed annually with the Academic Manager
2. Work with TEL, AV, facilities, student administration and examination areas as necessary to ensure an exceptional student experience
3. To attend planning meetings with the Academic Manager and other BA Voice Lecturers, to ensure quality content and clear channels of communication across the department
4. To facilitate student assessment and provide feedback to a range of student work in line with Conservatoire guidelines

5. Work with Marketing & Recruitment, to undertake student recruitment and marketing activities as defined by department heads.
6. Represent the Conservatoire internally and externally when required (e.g. showcases, graduation, productions and recruitment events).
7. To take part in staff development events in order to share good practice in your specialist area. To co-operate in any staff development activities required to effectively carry out the duties of the post and to participate in the Conservatoire Appraisal Scheme.
8. To comply with all Conservatoire policies and procedures.

Any other reasonable duties commensurate with the level of the post, which may be required from time to time.

1. Auditions, Open Days and any other activities without contracted hours would be paid additionally in agreement with the Academic Manager
2. Duties will inevitably develop and change as the work of the conservatoire changes to meet the needs of its service. Employees should therefore expect periodic variations to role descriptions, and Leeds Conservatoire reserves this right. This role description will be supplemented on a regular basis by individual objectives derived from new Conservatoire strategies.
